Section 2 – Plan Procedure Summary

In the event of a disaster or significant incident that may exceed the resources of an individual agency or the resources of an entire zone, that agency or zone may request mutual aid resources from other zones within the county. These resources have been identified within each zone and include the following:

- Structural Fire Task Forces
- Engine Company Strike Teams
- Ladder Company Strike Teams
- Basic Life Support Strike Teams
- Specialized Resources
 - Wildland Handcrews
 - Mobile Aid Units
 - ALS Mass Casualty Units
 - Swift Water Rescue
 - Water Tenders
 - Marine Rescue Boats

King County has been divided into three (3) geographical zones. Each zone has a coordinating dispatch center and a zone coordinator (See appendix B).

Procedure:

- Step 1:** The local Incident Commander shall request King County Resource Plan resources through their coordinating communications center. Specific information should include the following information:
- Type of resource (ie; task force, strike team, specialized resource). See Appendix A
 - Identify Zone (ie; engine strike team from Zone 1).
 - Identify base and/or check in location.
- Step 2:** The local coordinating communication center, in need of resources, shall notify the communication center from the zone identified by the Incident Commander and request the mutual aid resources.
- Step 3:** The communication center receiving a request for mutual aid shall dispatch pre-determined resources to the appropriate assembly point and notify the Zone Coordinator from the sending zone.
- Step 4:** The sending Zone Coordinator shall notify the Zone Coordinators from the other zones and the King Co. EOC Duty Officer of any resource movement under this plan.
